## ABOUT LODGE LIVING

Providing affordable housing for seniors, The Bethany Group manages 612 spaces of lodge living, including: Bashaw Meadows (Bashaw), Big Knife Lodge (Forestburg), Flagstaff Lodge (Sedgewick), Golden Leisure Lodge (Ponoka), Eckville Manor House (Eckville), Lacombe Senior Citizen's Lodge (Lacombe), Parkland Manor (Rimbey), Peace Hills Lodge (Wetaskiwin), Rosealta Lodge (Camrose), Stoney Creek Lodge (Camrose), and West Pine Lodge (Winfield).

Each lodge features its own unique community environment, as well as dedicated and friendly staff that help ensure residents enjoy life. From birthday celebrations to holidays, laughter and fun is encouraged.

The mandate of the Seniors Lodge Program is to provide affordable room and board for senior citizens who are functionally independent or functionally independent with the assistance of existing community-based services.

The facilities are audited by and in compliance with the standards set by the Government of Alberta.

## SERVICES

Each lodge offers the following services:

- basic room furnishings (if required);
- weekly housekeeping, including laundering of towels and linens;
- three meals per day and daily snacks;
- building security;
- 24-hour non-medical staffing;
- access to community-based services;
- laundry room for residents; and,
- opportunities for life enriching activities to enhance physical, emotional, social, spiritual, and intellectual well-being.

The provincial and federal governments provide income support programs to assist low-to-moderate income residents. Additional information on these programs is available by calling Alberta Supports toll free at 1-877-644-9992.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### Does the Lodge cater to special diets?

While we do not cater to special diets, a variety of food choices are prepared daily that should meet dietary requirements.

### Are wheelchairs or electric scooters allowed?

Non-electric wheelchairs are allowed in the lodge. However, electric wheelchairs and scooters are prohibited. If you use these for transportation, we do have parking available.

### Are family/guests allowed to stay over?

Some of our lodges do have a guest room available for a small fee. Please contact the lodge directly to find out more.

### How do I do my laundry?

Lodges have a laundry room that residents are welcome to use for personal items.

### Can I bring my pet?

While you cannot bring your own pet, some facilities have house pets. Families are also encouraged to bring pets for short visits as long as the pet is up-to-date in its vaccinations.

## LODGE RATES

Lodges rates are set by the local management body and may vary between different areas of the province.

Protection for low-income seniors is established by regulation under the Alberta Housing Act. To protect lower-income residents, management bodies must ensure that each senior resident 65+ years of age is left with at least \$315/month in disposable (after tax) income to spend on personal needs after paying his/her monthly basic lodge rate.

## ELIGIBILITY

All applications are rated according to a provincial priority rating system based on five areas:

- income;
- risk in current housing situation;
- degree of independence;
- housing needs; and,
- special circumstances.

Those who have the most significant need, as evaluated by the rating system, will go to the top of the waitlist.
